#### Dr. Allen Guelzo in June

Dr. Allen Guelzo was on hand for our June Meeting to receive the Richard B. Harwell Award for his book, *Gettysburg: The Last Invasion*. His presentation was excellent, and shed new light on this often studied battle. Our congratulations and thanks to Dr. Guelzo for visiting with us.

#### **Bud Robertson**

Our speaker to kickoff the new campaign year will be our long time friend and honorary member, Dr. James I. "Bud" Robertson. Bud is one of the pre-eminent Civil War scholars of our time and a familiar figure in numerous documentaries and television programs relating to the war. His accolades include being selected by JFK to be executive director of the National Centennial Commission.in 1961. He is the author of over 20 books and has edited at least as many. He is the leading authority on Stonewall Jackson as evidenced by his work, Stonewall Jackson: The Man, The Soldier, The Legend, for which he received our Richard B. Harwell Award in 1998. He was also an advisor to the film. Gods and Generals. All of the above accomplished while teaching thousands of Virginia Tech students about the Civil War. If that isn't enough, he also served as an Atlantic Coast Conference referee for 16 years.

Bud's topic for our September meeting will be, "What Ever Happened To...". His focus will be on the post-war lives of several notable figures from the war. This will be a special evening with one of the great Civil War historians. It is definitely be an opportunity to take advantage of. Make sure you don't miss out.
