Gen. James Longstreet: The Confederacy's Most Controversial Soldier

Eric Wisnia in February

Rabbi Wisnia presented a great program at the February meeting. He brought to light certain topics not discussed openly in today's history lessons. Hopefully you enjoyed his energy and enthusiasm, and maybe learned something new about the politics and times of the Civil War.

Gen. James Longstreet: The Confederacy's Most Controversial Soldier

Our March speaker will be Jeffry Wert. Jeffry is a long time friend of the Round Table and has visited us several times before.

His topic for the March meeting will be the man Robert E. Lee called "my war horse." In his biography of Longstreet, Wert makes a strong case for him as the best corps commander on either side of the Civil War. In his assessment he terms Longstreet a superb battle captain and a masterful tactician, who clearly recognized the limitations of the offensive under mid-19th century conditions. For Longstreet, Gettysburg in particular was not an opportunity, but a mistake. Wert argues convincingly that events vindicated Longstreet's opposition to Lee's insistence on repeatedly attacking the strong Union positions. Longstreet also recognized more clearly than most of his Confederate contemporaries that war was not an absolute. He accepted the political consequences military of defeat: reconciliation with the restored Union brought him the open contempt of irreconcilables like Jubal Early. The resulting controversies obscured Longstreet's military reputation. Be there in March to hear a balanced view of the career of one of America's great soldiers.

March 1 - 31, 2016: Paths of Destruction: Sherman's Final Campaign, South Carolina Confederate Relic Room & Military Museum, 301 Gervais Street, Columbia SC. Exhibit detailing Sherman's final efforts to quell the Confederacy in his army's march through South Carolina. The exhibit focuses on the march's impact on the people of South Carolina and its significance in development of the concept of total war. Artifacts include Union and Confederate weapons and accoutrements, ammunition, POW pieces, uniforms, excavated relics from locations along Sherman's path, and flags. Highlights of the exhibit are a life-size diorama depicting Columbia in flames. Open Tuesdays through Saturdays, 10:00 am to 5:00 pm, and first Sunday of each month from 1:00 to 5:00 pm. Richard B. Harwell Award

The Civil War Round Table of Atlanta has awarded its 28th annual Richard Barksdale Harwell Book Award to David A. Powell for his book, The Chickamauga Campaign - Glory or the Grave: The Breakthrough, the Union Collapse, and the Defense of Horseshoe Ridge, September 20, 1863. This work is the second book of a planned trilogy on the Chickamauga Campaign. Powell is the first two-time recipient of the Harwell Award. In 2011 he was recognized by the Round Table for his 2010 book on the same campaign, Failure in the Saddle: Nathan B. Forrest, Joe Wheeler and the Confederate Cavalry in the Chickamauga Campaign.

Previous winners include Jeffry Wert, Earl Hess, Gary Gallagher, William C. Davis, James I. "Bud" Robertson, James McPherson, Brian Steel Wills, Allen Guelzo and Russell S. Bonds. Powell will speak at the September 2016 meeting of the Atlanta Civil War Round Table and will be presented with the award at that time.

Other finalists for the 2016 award were Earl Hess for *The Battle of Ezra Church* and Donald Frazier for *Blood on the Bayou*.
