### Richard McMurry on Confederate Journalism

Longtime friend of the Atlanta Round Table, Dr. Richard McMurry, will be our speaker in December. Richard is a respected historian, humorist, author and lecturer in Civil War circles. Richard is a native of Atlanta, a graduate of Virginia Military Institute, and received a Ph.D. in history from Emory University under Bell Wiley. He is the author of numerous books and articles on the Civil War, including Two Great Rebel Armies: An Essay in Confederate Military History; John Bell Hood and the War for Southern Independence; The Fourth Battle of Winchester: Toward a New Civil War Paradigm; and Atlanta 1864: Last Chance for the Confederacy. Dr. McMurry has spoken several times to our Round Table.

Richard's topic in December will be *Venomous Toads and Buzzard Pukes: Confederate Journalism, 1861-1865.* Hard to tell what his opinion may be with a title so non-committal, but I am sure he will elaborate. Be there in December to find out what Richard really thinks.
